Gutun Zuria: words that cross the frontiers of books

Bilbao International Literature Festival is a reference for those who have an interest in contemporary literature. Every year, hundreds of people participate in Gutun Zuria to meet creators who share their wishes or expectations. In this edition, the word transcends, runs through the border of the pages of books and establishes dialogue with the rest of the artistic disciplines.

Through workshops in which to discover the narrative possibilities of art, through lectures and recitals in which the word and music are fused, as an editorial meeting point or through the pieces of an exhibition.

Artistic experiences that suggest complicity with artists of different disciplines, contributing value and enriching this event, where you are invited to share, converse, discuss, learn and leave your mark on literature.

This year's Festival is entitled *If my library burnt tonight. The art of narrating art.* The first part is inspired by Aldous Huxley's essay which reflects on how burning a library is a useless act since books can be read or owned again. The second alludes to a text by the poet José Lezama Lima on verbal art. Cause literature is an art that need readers. The apotheosis of the visual images, instead of diluting it, reaffirms their survival.

Gutun Zuria connects with what would be the preamble to the Festival, the exhibition *Never real / Always true* displayed at the Exhibition Hall from March 14th to September 22nd. This exhibition curated by Iván de la Nuez, essayist, art critic and curator, who is also an advisor alongside Iñaki Esteban, Beñat Sarasola and the team from Azkuna Zentroa. In Azkuna Zentroa we have started a new era as a Contemporary Culture and Society with the intention of adding value to everything we have done so far, through an expanded cultural programming, with new formats and designed for all public communities. We are striving to optimize and dialogue different areas of programming, favouring the everydayness of the contemporary. This is the case of Gutun Zuria.

The Festival breathes the style of the rest of Centres programming, and crosses languages and disciplines, connects from the artistic practice and puts the accent on creation from in different forms, directing its gaze to a diversity of audiences.

Gutun Zuria puts value on the word as a contemporary artistic axis and becomes an open and expanded Festival in its theme, public and formats.



If my library burnt tonight

The art of narrating art

Azkuna Zentroa holds a new edition of Gutun Zuria, the Bilbao International Literature Festival from 2nd to 6th April.

The event has been renewed to open up to new kinds of public and other formats. In addition to the conversations with international and local writers, there is an entire public programme of activities, which turn Gutun Zuria into a literature festival expanding towards the creation and outreach of new languages.

The word takes shape via artistic practices. music, audio-visual or education. With artist workshops which reveal the narrative possibilities of the art to functionally different public, with performances that tend bridges between music and other artistic practices, with meetings on the independent Edition and agents of Basque literary production, with dialogues and round tables dealing with expansion of the narrative in Basque to other facets of the creation... Artistic experiences suggest complicity with artists of different disciplines contributing value and enriching this event, where you are invited to share, converse, discuss, learn and leave your mark on literature.

Gutun Zuria conquests all the Alhondiga Bilbao space: from the Auditorium to Mediateka, the Atrium or Lantegia, the news space for the cultural creation and innovation; hosting morning, afternoon and night programming.

All the foregoing is implicit in the title of this year's Gutun Zuria: *If my library burnt tonight. The art of narrating art.* The first part is inspired by Aldous Huxley's essay which reflects on how burning a library is a useless act since books can be read or owned again. The second alludes to a text by the poet José Lezama Lima on verbal art.

In this edition we aim to delete frontiers between literature and art, tending bridges between both concepts, starting from contemplating the book as a creative open process to artistic expression and at the same time, observing the images as a testimony and document. Art and literature / word and image, act in a parallel way, not complementary, looking for the integration of readers and spectators in a simultaneous story.

As a preamble to the Festival and extension thereof, on 14th March Azkuna Zentroa inaugurates the exhibition *Never real / Always true* produced by the Centre itself. This exhibition curated by Iván de la Nuez, essayist, art critic and curator, dialogues about many of the concepts we will be going over at Gutun Zuria through the work of 13 artists who move between both worlds and whose works naturally treat art as a literary genre and literature as an exhibition project.

Visual artist who writes. She has published the books *Mudanza* (2010, RE-2017) and *Conjunto vacio* (2015). Iván de la Nuez (La Habana, 1964)

Is an essayist, critic and curator. Among his books are *The Perpetual Raft, The Map of Salt, Red Fantasy, The Manifesting Communist* and *Theory of the Rearguard*. His exhibitions include *Never real / Always true*, showing at Azkuna Zentroa from March 14th. He is a Gutun Zuria Advisor.

Maialen Lujanbio

Although known in particular for her work as a bertsolari, Maialen Lujanbio has also explored bertsolarism boundaries and beyond. Over the years, she has built numerous bridges with bertsolarism and other contemporary artistic disciplines (music, live arts, fiction, etc.) from both a discursive point of view and via its artistic practice (*Ornitorrinkus, Txori mugariak, Balitzen hioa*). The itinerary of her talk will in fact be these bridges, upon which she will reflect the relationship between bertsolarism and surrounding arts. Bertsolarism has frequently been viewed as an isolated marginal activity, yet maybe it has a greater relation with other arts than we think? For example, how related is it to poetry? Where do their differences lie? How are hierarchies materialised among the different artistic disciplines?

Cristina de Middel (Alicante, 1975)

Since her beginnings in photo-journalism, nothing of a photographic nature has been alien to her.

Her series (from *Los Afronautas* to *Pop Totem*, including *Party*) act like visual novels, small iconographic treaties or documents on manipulation of reality. National Photography Prizewinner, curator of Photo Spain or a Magnum nominee, her narrations are an antidote against solemnity, in both art and literature.

Joan Fontcuberta (Barcelona, 1955)

He is, perhaps, the least literal photographer and the most literary of all. As a writer, he has won the National Essay Award and, as an artist, the National Photography Prize as well as the Hasselblad Award (catalogued as the Nobel Prize in Literature or the Pritzker Architecture Prize).

His photographic fictions are already legendary to the point of being assumed as true, and they have received increasing attention in the news and TV programmes, as occurred with the cosmonaut Ivan Istoichnikov or the photographer Ximo Berenguer.

Agustín Fernández Mallo (La Coruña, 1967)

This author's year was 2018. He began by winning the Biblioteca Breve award for his novel *Trilogía de la guerra*, and finished with a no less ambitious essay: Teoría general *de la basura*.

Founder of the so-called 'Nocilla Generation' and artifice of expanded literature in Spain, his writing is a natural cross between text and visual image which is not understood without the hallmark of sculptor Robert Smithson, minimalism or land art.

Harkaitz Cano and Xabier Gantzarain

Harkaitz Cano and Xabier Gantzarain are old friends, ever since they formed the literary group 'Lubaki Band' with other young writers in the 90s. Since then, Cano has had a fertile literary career, where contemporary art has had a palpable presence in his work. Despite this, to date he has not really emphasised this aspect and is a topic still pending. Gantzarain has always moved around art and literary boundaries. Having studied art, he is known for his work as a book cover designer (some of Cano's books amongst them). He has recently published an interesting essay on contemporary Basque art (*Zuloa*), where he talks about post-'Gaur Group' art, through several works and artists.

With regard to all the foregoing, the two authors will not only converse about the relationship established between Cano's literature and contemporary art, but they will also be dealing with contemporary Basque art and the design of book covers.

ROUNDTABLE: THE ART OF NARRATING ART

Carlos Fonseca, Juan Vico and Valérie Mréjen with Julián Rodríguez



Carlos Fonseca (San José, Costa Rica, 1987)

With novels like *Museo animal* and *Coronel Lágrimas*, this author has been confirmed as an undisputed literary revelation. In his narrative, art appears as a conspiracy where the value of the file, documents or collections abound as environments within the limit of reality. Furthermore, he is the owner of a particular cartography which zigzags between the Caribbean and Pyrenees, New York and the jungle.

His books are circular, built from the memory provided by photography, museography or lost letters.

Juan Vico (Badalona, 1975)

Poet, novelist and publisher. His works *El teatro de la luz*, *Hobo* or *El animal más triste* tense his writing from art or cinema, like rites of passage, to rebuild a lost memory. In this way, it looks as though it were necessary to start from images in order to delve into the past and expound on it at length in the present. This confluence is sustained in his poetry (*Vispera de ayer*, *Still Life*, *La balada de Molly Sinclair*) and in all his publishing activity.

Valérie Mréjen (París, 1969)

Her novel *My Grandfather* was a special event in France. It is a sharp and sophisticated text at the same time, based on how we relate with others and their secrets. This inquiring is a persistent trump card of this writer/artist, whose films were defined by Jean-Luc Douin in Le Monde as novels in Super 8.

Among her books we can also find *El agrio* and *Eau* Sauvage, likewise the documentary/essay Pork and Milk.

Julián Rodríguez (Ceclavín, Cáceres, 1968)

He edited and directed the *Sub rosa* art and aesthetic magazine in the early 90s. He is currently the artistic director of the art gallery Casa sin fin and literary director of the Periférica publishing house. Some of his novels are: *Antecedentes* (2010); *Lo improbable* (2001), *Ninguna necesidad* (2006) and *La sombra y la penumbra* (2002).

Eric Dicharry, Beatriz Chivite and Danele Sarriugarte with Beñat Sarasola



We are presenting the works of 3 writers, where the importance of contemporary art is patent. The 3 write literature, and have recently been published widely. However, each views art from his/her own perspective.

Eric Dicharry (Baiona 1969) usually mixes creativity with research, and some of his works, such as those of visual poetry, could equally come under the heading of contemporary art.

Beatriz Chivite (Iruñea, 1991) has also studied art and observed with particular interest the art of oriental cultures. Therefore, her poetic works contain abundant reflections on art and ooze oriental sensitivity.

In the case of Danele Sarriugarte (Elgoibar, 1989), her latest novel (*Azala erre*) is focused on the world of art, i.e. topics related to power, the established connections between success and failure, and public image.

Beñat Sarasola (Donostia-San Sebastián, 1984) is a writer, a researcher and a Gutun Zuria Advisor. As a writer he has published 2 books of poetry, *Kaxa Huts Bat* and *Alea*. Furthermore, he has just published his first novel, *Deklaratzekorik ez*. As a publisher, he directs the collection *Munduko Poesia Kaierak* by Susa publishers, which translates the best modern contemporary poetry into Basque.

Hence, this roundtable offers us an opportunity to get to know how some Basque writers approach contemporary art. How is art and literature connected? How do the literary and artistic institutions do this? Which are the boundaries that separate them?

Bernado Atxaga and Oskar Alegria

Bernardo Atxaga (Asteasu, 1951)

Joseba Irazu Garmendia, graduated in Economics for the Bilbao University, belongs to the young group of Basque writers that began publishing in his mother language, Euskera, in the Seventies. The author of several books, including, *Obabakoak* (1988), *The Lone Man* (1996), *The Lone Woman* (1999), *Two Brothers* (2001), *The Accordionist's Son* (2007), *Seven Houses in France* (2011) and *Nevadako egunak* (2013). His books have been translated into thirty-two languages.

Oskar Alegria (Pamplona, 1973)

A journalist by training, he writes travel articles for the *El Viajero* supplement of the El País newspaper and is also the creator of an artistic photography project called *Visible Cities*, supported by the writer Enrique Vila-Matas. His first feature length film, *Emak Bakia baita* (*The Emak Bakia house*), has toured 70 international festivals and has been awarded 15 prizes and translated into 13 languages.

(Madrid, 1964)

Christina Rosenvinge's *Debut* includes over 25 years of songs, and travels through the places, stories and reflections hidden in her lyrics. The lyrics of an entire career in her book together with the recreation of the notebooks which have always accompanied her. Criss-crossing this book are the literary, musical and artistic references which have influenced the work of this singer-songwriter. *The precise word*, an essay which delves into the art of songwriting and a reflection on the secrets of how to thread word and melody into a sung verse, closes this volume.

Chico y Chica (Bilbao, 1996)

'Chico y Chica' is a musical duet born in Bilbao integrated by José Luis Rebollo and Alicia San Juan. They are characterize for their independent pop and electropop style. Their records are primarily danceable, with sour, fun and ironic lyrics and catchy choruses. Their latest work has been *Un, dos, tres, orgasmo* (Austrohúngaro, 2017)

Enrique Vila-Matas (Barcelona, 1948)

In the story *Me dicen que diga mi nombre* and *An Oblique Novel*, his recent exhibition as a curator at the London Tate Gallery, passing through *The Illogic of Kassel*, art has been functioning as a 'constructive' element of a work which has always resisted being fit into a single compartment or exclusive classification.

Like Blanchot, Vila-Matas believes writers are artists, and at the same time he is capable of taking 6 works of art and reconstruct his autobiography from them. It is difficult to find another writer who has so radically and, so to say, naturally erased the frontiers between art and literature.

Alicia Kopf (Girona, 1982)

To advance in art like someone who advances along the pole, like someone who advances through life, and like someone who looks over a precipice seeking the response in a word or image. She draws a form of writing which is uncomfortable in literature, and creates a form of art which does not settle in the comfort zone of its System.

This is what Alicia Kopf has achieved with her first novel, *Brother in Ice*, and in *Conquest drawings*, a series which emanates from that expedition, which is interior and exterior, proximate and abysmal at the same time.

Iñaki Esteban (Amurrio, 1961)

Gutun Zuria Advisor since its first edition, author of *El efecto Guggenheim* and *Libertad y sentido en las sociedades democráticas*, Miguel de Unamuno Essay Prizewinner, and co-author of the Diccionario de la existencia, a collective volume with the participation of philosophers of renowned international prestige. He is a professor of El Correo Journalism Master at the University of the Basque Country, and a journalist with El Correo collaborating in various cultural publications and radio programmes dedicated to literature. The Guild of Catalonian Publishers awarded him the Atlantida Prize in 2002, as the best article writer of the year. He organises the 'Café Voltaire' conversation forum at Bidebarrieta Kulturgunea.

(Wroclaw, 1985)

Although it is ever more difficult to define his style (a rare hybrid of poetry, jazz, rap and slam), Rafael Lechowski is considered one of the most important Spanish speaking lyricists in his genre. His voice is becoming more and more well-known, exercising a notable influence in both Spain and Latin America. He was just 17 when he made his debut, and was nominated a 'Young Prodigy of National Art' by the daily newspaper El País, in 2004. However, critics did not hold back their praise when including him among the best in Europe in 2007 for his work *Donde duele, inspira.* In 2014 he published *Larga brevedad*, a work which was 18 successive weeks among the most sold books for all genres on the national lists. In 2015 he represented Spain at the World Poetry Movement.

The destruction of words is a beautiful thing

If «imagining a language, means imaging a form of life» and if «a neologism is like a fresh seed to be thrown into terrain of debate» (as Walter Benjamin stated), then, perhaps it is time to go beyond the natural flexibility of languages and academic regulations to endeavour to transform its boundaries and formats. The statements of futuristic literature and George Orwell's Principles of Newspeak will be the starting point to discuss and envisage alternative syntaxes which enable us to write and create images from another place. Donna Hathaway suggests «We need other kinds of stories», because even though «we do not have the words for that now», we will try to sketch them with a different writing, one capable of thinking and tackling the various crises (ecological, social, political, economic and technological) we will be living in the future, including dystopia, which is now our present.

This workshop is imparted by the Mexican writer and artist erónica Gerber Bicecci, who opens this edition of Gutun Zuria with the Cuban essayist, critic and curator Iván de la Nuez.
